Bus Passes

If you require a **<u>Bus Pass</u>** for your child, please write a note in the Student Agenda. You must indicate the following:

- person's name where your child is going
- their address (legal land description)
- their phone number
- Parent/Guardian signature & phone number

Phone calls to the school are not accepted for end of day busing changes.

We can accept emails with all information included. But if you have not received a confirmation email from the school, the information has not been received, and your child has NOT received a Bus Pass.

<u>ANY</u> changes to the end of the day, (ie. bus student is now being picked-up MUST be received prior to 2 p.m.) If you do have an emergency after that time, please call the school division office directly at 204-739-2101.

If you would like to accompany your child on the trip, you must have a **Criminal Record Check** and a **Child Abuse Summary** completed. We also planted vegetables and flowers with our land-based coordinator (Andrea Neiser) which was a wonderful learning opportunity about what plants need to grow and survive.

















The Grade 3 class has been busy working on persuasive writing! We read different books about persuasive writing and highlighted some of the techniques a writer might use when trying to convince someone of their opinion. We then brainstormed various topics we could write about and did a shared writing piece titled, "Why We Think School Should End Early." Then each student decided on their own persuasive writing piece to complete. They completed a graphic organizer, wrote, edited and revised their rough copies and then finally presented their good copies in typed format.













May 11 was Moose Hide Campaign Day:

"The Moose Hide Campaign is a grassroots movement of Indigenous and non-Indigenous men and boys who are standing up against violence towards women and children. Our Campaign was born out of love and comes as a strong response to the Calls to Action, Calls for Justice, and the United Nations Declaration of the Rights of Indigenous Peoples."

As a class we watched some videos about Moose Hide Campaign Day. We listened to stories and learned about the importance of the moose to Indigenous Peoples. We learned there are four categories of staying healthy: physical, spiritual, mental, and emotional health. Then we decorated a medicine wheel circle of health by drawing pictures of things we can do to keep each part healthy.

At the end of the day, students received a moose hide pin. They pledged to use their moose hide pin as a symbol of their promise to be respectful to others and to use the strength of the moose to stand up against violence towards others.
