


#### Grade 5/6

There has been lots of events and fun learning. The Grade 5/6's want to highlight 2 fun events they have had. On April 8<sup>th</sup>, the Grade 5/6 class went to Fisher Branch to participate in a full day of Badminton. We joined Ashern school on the bus and spent the day eating yummy food and playing lots and lots of games. On April 24<sup>th</sup> students participated in our Student Vote. ## Grade 7/8



The grade 7/8's had an in-house 7 team double elimination badminton tournament. Brody and Conway narrowly defeated Taylor and Ethan in the doubles final. We participated in the Divisional Badminton tournament in Ashern on April 9th. Students competed in three categories of play. Girls singles: Alexis, Georgie, Hayleigh; Boys singles: Alex, Conway; Boys doubles: Alen& Andrew, Ethan & Carson, Taylor & Brody, Marcus & Ryker. Games were to 15 points, and we got to play against teams from Ashern, Eriksdale, and Fisher Branch. It was an enjoyable day of badminton! The focus for math is algebra. Expressions, equations, solving for the unknown, and modelling with algebra tiles are key concepts. Review for the last foundational outcome quiz is ongoing. In science we are studying Forces and Structures which allows for building with various materials to test structural strength and stability. A read aloud book in ELA will close out the year.

The grade 8's enjoyed mooing over the intercom as" mystery mooers" for spirit week. Currently, the grade 8's are designing their ceiling tile and making plans for grad. Exciting times!
